After Heart Attack or Heart Stents

There are many treatment options. Always tell your doctor if you have any side effects that concern you. Your doctor will work with you to find which medications are best for your lifestyle.

Beta Blockers Coreg/Carvedilol Metoprolol/Toprol Atenolol	 Help prevent heart attacks Improve weakened heart Help with angina symptoms Treat fast heart rate Treat high blood pressure Mood or neurological conditions 	 Dizziness Slow heartbeat Low blood pressure Tiredness, weakness Depression Diarrhea Change in sexual desire or ability 	 DO NOT suddenly stop taking this medicine Do not run out of this medicine Take missed doses as soon as possible
ACE Inhibitors Angiotensin II Receptor Blockers	 Improve weakened heart Protect the kidneys of patients with Diabetes Treat high blood pressure 	 Dry cough (Ace Inhibitors only) Dizziness, especially when standing or sitting quickly Abnormal taste 	 Do not take antacids within 2 hours Avoid alcohol Check with your doctor before starting It may not mix well with other medicines
Aspirin	 Help prevent clots that cause stroke and heart attack Treat pain/swelling or fever Help protect heart bypass grafts and stents 	Upset stomachHeartburnBleeding problemsNausea	Do NOT STOP this medication unless instructed by Cardiologist Take with food / Do not drink alcohol
Anti-Platelet Medications O Plavix/Clopidogrel O Effient/Prasugrel O Brilinta/ticagrelor	Help prevent clots that cause stroke and heart attack. Help protect heart and stents	 Upset stomach/pain Heartburn Bleeding problems Nausea Diarrhea Headache Flu-like symptoms 	Do NOT STOP this medication unless instructed by Cardiologist Take missed doses as soon as possible Avoid injury You may bleed more easily Tell Dentists and other doctors that you are on this medication Talk with your doctor before taking vitamins, supplements or other medicine Take with food / Do not drink alcohol
Statins O Atorvastatin O Simvistatin O	 Help lower cholesterol and triglycerides. Help slow the progress of heart disease Help prevent more heart attacks 	Belly painHeadacheDiarrhea or constipationMuscle weaknessJoint pain	 DO NOT suddenly stop taking this medicine Wear sunscreen - You may get sunburned more easily Avoid grapefruit juice Limit or avoid alcohol
Nitroglycerin Tablets	Chest Pain Helps improve blood flow in the heart	Dizziness, especially when standing or sitting quickly Headache	 Avoid alcohol May cause low blood pressure, sit or lie down before taking Keep tablets in their original container Replace tablets in 6 months if bottle has been opened If your symptoms continue after 2 doses call 911
